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## Overview:

To help provide public protection and promote professional development and quality service, the *Health Professionals Act*, SNL 2010, c.H-1.02 section 29(3) (a) states that Colleges regulated under the Act can approve a program of study and education for the purpose of establishing education requirements. Approved Programs of study are identified in the Approved Programs of Study Policy.

## Policy:

Upon application to register, applicants who graduate from programs other than those outlined in Approved Programs of Study policy (# 2-10) must provide documentation that they have the necessary qualifications to be licensed as an Audiologist or Speech-Language Pathologist in Newfoundland and Labrador. This will ensure that a registrant's knowledge base, skills, and professional networks are current and reflect the basic standard of practice for the registrant's area of practice.

## PROCEDURE:

- The applicant shall submit a completed registration form and applicable fees to the Newfoundland and Labrador Council of Health Professionals (NLCHP) as well as all other documentation outlined in the registration form.

- The applicant shall provide NLCHP with a verification letter from Speech-Language and Audiology Canada (SAC) if she/he is a current certified member of SAC.

**NOTE:** Applicants certified in other countries may seek information on Mutual Recognition Agreements with SAC.

- An applicant who is not a certified member of SAC must provide NLCHP with the following:

- Original or certified true copies of degrees, diplomas, certificates, etc.
- Official transcript confirming the date on which the graduate degree was conferred and verified; documents must be original and sent to NLHCP directly from the issuing university. Transcripts that are received by the applicant in a university sealed envelope must not be opened by the applicant.
- Academic credentials assessment obtained from one of the following credentialing agencies:
  - International Qualifications Assessment Service (IQAS)
  - World Education Services
  - University of Toronto - Comparative Education Service
  - International Credential Evaluation Service (ICES)

**NOTE:** The cost of academic credential assessment is the responsibility of the applicant.

- Proof of passing a College approved certification exam (See the Certification Exam Policy).

**NOTE:** The cost for writing the College approved registration exam is the responsibility of the applicant.

- A current résumé

**NOTE:** If the applicant is unable to obtain official copies of their transcripts and other documents due to circumstances beyond their control, they must provide a letter explaining their situation and may provide certified true copies of their original documents upon approval of the Registrar.
